**IN RE: FORFEITURE OF
COLLATERAL IN LIEU OF
APPEARANCE**

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* **STANDING ORDER NO. 1**
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As per Rule 58(d) of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, for the misdemeanors listed below,¹ whether originating under the applicable Federal Statute or Regulations or applicable state statute by virtue of the Assimilated Crimes Act (18 U.S.C. § 13), occurring within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States, including areas within but not exclusive to: the boundaries of the United States military installations, bases and outposts, the boundaries of National Forest lands, the boundaries of Veterans Administration properties, the boundaries of Corps of Engineers properties, as well as any other lands, buildings, bodies of water or areas within the district where the Federal Court has jurisdiction, exclusive or concurrent, it is hereby ordered that collateral may be posted in lieu of the appearance of the offender.

Upon the failure of the person charged with an offense/misdemeanor or offenses/misdemeanors to appear before the designated United States Magistrate Judge for trial of the offenses listed below, the collateral in the amount listed below shall be forfeited to the United States and the forfeiture of said collateral shall signify that the offender does not contest the charge nor request a hearing before the designated United States Magistrate Judge. If the collateral is forfeited, such action shall be tantamount to a finding of guilty. In case of conviction of a traffic violation, either the Clerk or Magistrate Judge shall certify the record of said conviction to the proper State authority as required by the applicable State statute.

Aiding, abetting or causing a violation of the misdemeanors listed below will result in punishment of the offender as though that person acted as a principal, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §

2. Persons charged with misdemeanors not listed or with offenses requiring mandatory appearance must appear for arraignment and trial.

Applicable throughout the district where the Federal Court has jurisdiction, exclusive or concurrent, the offenses for which collateral may be posted in lieu of appearance by the person charged with said offenses are:

¹ The term “misdemeanor” includes “petty offenses and other misdemeanors” pursuant to Fed.R.Crim.P. 58. “[T]he term ‘petty offense’ means a Class B misdemeanor, a Class C misdemeanor, or an infraction, for which the maximum fine is no greater than the amount set forth for such an offense in section 3571(b)(6) or (7) in the case of an individual . . .” 18 U.S.C § 19. An individual found guilty of a Class B or Class C misdemeanor that does not result in death, or an infraction, may be fined not more than \$5,000. 18 U.S.C. § 3571(b)(6) & (7). A defendant who is found guilty of a Class B misdemeanor may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment of not more than six months, 18 U.S.C. § 3581(b)(7); of a Class C misdemeanor, not more than thirty days, 18 U.S.C. § 3581(b)(8); and of an infraction, not more than five days, 18 U.S.C. §3581(b)(9). The term “other misdemeanor,” as used in Rule 58, means a Class A misdemeanor inasmuch as this is the only other type of misdemeanor as per 18 U.S.C. § 3559(a)(6). A defendant found guilty of a Class A misdemeanor may be sentenced to a term of imprisonment of not more than one year, 18 U.S.C. § 3581(b)(6), and for a Class A misdemeanor that does not result in death, the defendant is subject to a fine of not more than \$100,000, 18 U.S.C. § 3571(b)(5).

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**I. SCHEDULE OF OFFENSES ON ALL NATIONAL FOREST LANDS

A. OFFENSES GENERALLY PROHIBITED COLLATERAL

36 C.F.R. 261.3, Interfering with or giving false report to a Forest Officer

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Threatening, resisting, intimidating, or interfering with any forest officer engaged in or on account of the performance of his official duties in the protection, improvement, or administration of the National Forest System	\$500 -or- MA
(b)	Giving any false, fictitious or fraudulent report or other information to any forest officer engaged in or on account of the performance of his official duties knowing that such report or other information contains a false, fictitious or fraudulent statement or entry.	\$500 -or- MA
(c)	Threatening, intimidating, or intentionally interfering with any forest officer, volunteer, or human resource program enrollee while engaged in, or on account of, the performance of duties for the protection, improvement, or administration of the National Forest System or other duties assigned by the Forest Service.	\$500 -or- MA

36 C.F.R. 261.4, Disorderly conduct

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Engaging in fighting	\$500-or-MA
(b)	Addressing any offensive, derisive, or annoying communication to any other person who is lawfully present when such communication has a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person to whom, individually, the remark is addressed.	\$150
(c)	Make statements or other actions directed toward inciting or producing imminent lawless action and likely to incite or produce such action	MA
(d)	Causing public inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm by making unreasonably loud noise.	\$100

36 C.F.R. 261.5, Fire

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Carelessly or negligently throwing or placing any ignited substance or other substance that may cause a fire.	\$100
(b)	Firing any tracer bullet or incendiary ammunition.	\$250
(c)	Causing timber, trees, slash, brush or grass to burn except as authorized by permit.	\$250
(d)	Leaving a fire without completely extinguishing it.	\$100
(e)	Causing and failing to maintain control of a fire that is not a prescribed fire that damages the National Forest System.	\$100
(f)	Building, attending, maintaining or using a campfire without removing all flammable material from around the campfire adequate to prevent its escape.	\$100
(g)	Negligently failing to maintain control of a prescribed fire on Non-National Forest System lands that damages the National Forest System.	\$100

36 C.F.R. 261.6, Timber and Other Forest Products

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Cutting or otherwise damaging any timber, tree or other forest product, except as authorized by a special-use authorization, timber sale contract, or Federal law or regulation.	\$500 -or- MA
(b)	Cutting any standing tree, under permit or timber sale contract, before a forest officer has marked it or has otherwise designated it for cutting.	\$500 -or- MA
(c)	Removing any timber or other forest product cut under permit or timber sale contract, except to a place designated for scaling, or removing it from that place before it is scaled, measured, counted, or otherwise accounted for by a forest officer.	\$500 -or- MA
(d)	Stamping, marking with paint, or otherwise identifying any tree or other forest product in a manner similar to that employed by forest officers to mark or designate a tree or any other forest product for cutting or removal.	\$500 -or- MA
(e)	Loading, removing or hauling timber or other forest product acquired under any permit or timber sale contract unless such product is identified as required in such permit or contract.	\$500-or- MA
(f)	Selling or exchanging any timber or other forest product obtained under free use pursuant to §§ 223.5 through 223.11.	\$500 -or- MA
(g)	Violating any timber export or substitution restriction in §§ 223.160 through 223.164.	\$500 -or- MA
(h)	Removing any timber, tree or other forest product, except as authorized by a special use authorization, timber sale contract, or Federal law or regulation.	100 or under - \$150 (per specimen) over 100-\$250 (per specimen)

36 C.F.R. 261.7, Livestock

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Placing or allowing unauthorized livestock to enter or be in the National Forest System or other lands under Forest Service control.	\$100
(b)	Not removing unauthorized livestock from the National Forest System or other lands under Forest Service control when requested by a forest officer.	\$250
(c)	Failing to reclose any gate or other entry.	\$100
(d)	Molesting, injuring, removing or releasing any livestock impounded under § 262.10 while in the custody of the Forest Service or its authorized agents.	\$250

36 C.F.R. 261.8, Fish and Wildlife

The following are prohibited to the extent Federal or State law is violated:

(a)	Hunting, trapping and fishing	\$250

(c)	Damaging any plant that is classified as a threatened, endangered, sensitive, rare, or unique species.	\$250 (per specimen)
(d)	Removing any plant that is classified as a threatened, endangered, sensitive, rare, or unique species	\$250 (per specimen)

(e)	Entering any building, structure, or enclosed area owned or controlled by the United States when such building, structure, or enclosed area is not open to the public.	\$200

36 C.F.R. 261.10, Occupancy and Use

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Constructing, placing, or maintaining any kind of road, trail, structure, fence, enclosure, communication equipment, or other improvement on National Forest System land or facilities without a special-use authorization, contract, or approved operating plan when such authorization is required.	\$500 -or- MA
(b)	Constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, occupying or using a residence on National Forest System lands unless authorized by a special-use authorization or approved operating plan when such authorization is required.	MA
(c)	Selling or offering for sale any merchandise or conducting any kind of work activity or service unless authorized by Federal law, regulation, or special-use authorization.	\$250 -or- MA
(d)	Discharging a firearm or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing injury, or damaging property: (1) in or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area; (2) across or on a National Forest System road or a body of water adjacent thereto, or in any manner or place whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage as a result of such discharge; or (3) into or within any cave.	\$200
(e)	Abandoning any personal property.	\$150
(f)	Placing a vehicle or other object in such a manner that it is an impediment or hazard to the safety or convenience of any person.	\$250
(g)	Commercial distribution of printed material without a special use authorization.	\$150

(h)	When commercially distributing printed material, delaying, halting, or preventing administrative use of an area by the Forest Service or other scheduled or existing uses or activities on National Forest System lands; misrepresenting the purposes or affiliations of those selling or distributing the material; or misrepresenting the availability of the material without cost.	\$200
(i)	Operating or using in or near a campsite, developed recreation site, or over an adjacent body of water without a permit, any device which produces noise, such as a radio, television, musical instrument, motor or engine in such a manner and at such a time so as to unreasonably disturb any person.	\$100
(j)	Operating or using a public address system, whether fixed, portable or vehicle mounted, in or near a campsite or developed recreation site or over an adjacent body of water without a special-use authorization.	\$100
(k)	Use or occupancy of National Forest System land or facilities without special-use authorization when such authorization is required.	\$100
(l)	Violating any term or condition of a special-use authorization, contract or approved operating plan.	\$100
(m)	Failing to stop a vehicle when directed to do so by a forest officer.	\$500 -or- MA
(n)	Failing to pay any special use fee or other charges as required.	\$100
(o)	Discharging or igniting a firecracker, rocket or other firework, or explosive into or within any cave.	\$150
(p)	Use or occupancy of National Forest System lands or facilities without an approved operating plan when such authorization is required.	\$150

36 C.F.R. 261.11, Sanitation

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Depositing in any toilet, toilet vault, or plumbing fixture any substance which could damage or interfere with the operation or maintenance of the fixture.	\$100
(b)	Possessing or leaving refuse, debris, or litter in an exposed or unsanitary condition.	\$150
(c)	Placing in or near a stream, lake, or other water any substance which does or may pollute a stream, lake, or other water.	\$250
(d)	Failing to dispose of all garbage, including any paper, can, bottle, sewage, waste water or material, or rubbish either by removal from the site or area, or by depositing it into receptacles or at places provided for such purposes.	\$150
(e)	Dumping of any refuse, debris, trash or litter brought as such from private property or from land occupied under permit, except, where a container, dump or similar facility has been provided and is identified as such, to receive trash generated from private lands or lands occupied under permit.	\$ 300

36 C.F.R. 261.12, Forest Development Roads and Trails

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Violating the load, weight, height, length or width limitations prescribed by State law except by special-use authorization or written agreement or by order issued under § 261.54 of this Chapter.	\$150
(b)	Failing to have a vehicle weighed at a Forest Service weighing station, if required by a sign.	\$150
(c)	Damaging and leaving in a damaged condition any such road, trail, or segment thereof.	\$250
(d)	Blocking, restricting, or otherwise interfering with the use of a road, trail, or gate.	\$150

36 C.F.R. 261.13, Motor Vehicle Use Other Than as Designated

It is prohibited to possess or operate a motor vehicle on National Forest System lands in that administrative unit or Ranger District other than as designated or exempted.	\$150
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36 C.F.R. 261.15, Use of Vehicles Off Roads

It is prohibited to operate any vehicle off National Forest System, State or County roads:

(a)	Without a valid license as required by State law.	\$350
(b)	Without an operable braking system.	\$100
(c)	From one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise unless equipped with working head and tail lights.	\$100
(d)	In violation of any applicable noise emission standard established by any Federal or State agency.	\$100
(e)	While under the influence of alcohol or other drug.	\$500
(f)	Creating excessive or unusual smoke.	\$75
(g)	Carelessly, recklessly, or without regard for the safety of any person, or in a manner that endangers, or is likely to endanger, any person or property.	\$250
(h)	In a manner which damages or unreasonably disturbs the land, wildlife, or vegetative resources.	\$250
(i)	In violation of State law established for vehicles used off roads.	\$100

36 C.F.R. 261.16, Developed Recreation Sites

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Occupying any portion of the site for other than recreation purposes.	\$100
(b)	Building, attending, maintaining, or using a fire outside of a fire ring provided by the Forest Service for such purpose or outside of a stove, grill or fireplace.	\$100
(c)	Cleaning or washing any personal property, fish, animal, or food, or bathing or washing at a hydrant or water faucet not provided for that purpose.	\$75
(d)	Discharging or igniting a firecracker, rocket or other firework, or explosive.	\$100
(e)	Occupying between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. a place designated for day use only.	\$100
(f)	Failing to remove all camping equipment or personal property when vacating the area or site.	\$150
(g)	Placing, maintaining, or using camping equipment except in a place specifically designated or provided for such equipment.	\$100
(h)	Without permission, failing to have at least one person occupy a camping area during the first night after camping equipment has been set up.	\$100
(i)	Leaving camping equipment unattended for more than 24 hours without permission.	\$75
(j)	Bringing in or possessing an animal, other than a service animal, unless it is crated, caged, or upon a leash not longer than six feet, or otherwise under physical restrictive control.	\$100
(k)	Bringing in or possessing in a swimming area an animal, other than a service animal.	\$100
(l)	Bringing in or possessing a saddle, pack, or draft animal except as authorized by posted instructions.	\$100
(m)	Operating or parking a motor vehicle or trailer except in places developed or designated for this purpose.	\$100
(n)	Operating a bicycle, motorbike, or motorcycle on a trail unless designated for this use.	\$100
(o)	Operating a motorbike, motorcycle, or other motor vehicle for any purpose other than entering or leaving the site.	\$100

Failure to pay any recreation fee is prohibited. Notwithstanding 18 U.S.C. 3571(e), the fine imposed for the first offense of nonpayment shall not exceed \$100.	\$100
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36 C.F.R. 261.18, National Forest Wilderness

The following are prohibited in a National Forest Wilderness:

(a)	Possessing or using a motor vehicle, motorboat or motorized equipment except as authorized by Federal law or regulation.	\$250
(b)	Possessing or using a hang glider or bicycle.	\$100
(c)	Landing of aircraft, or dropping or picking up of any material, supplies, or person by means of aircraft, including a helicopter.	\$500 -or- MA

36 C.F.R. 261.22, “Smokey Bear” and “Woodsy Owl” symbols

The following are prohibited:

(a)	Unauthorized manufacture, importation, reproduction or use of “Smokey Bear.”	\$250 -or- MA
(b)	Unauthorized manufacture, importation, reproduction or use of “Woodsy Owl.”	\$250 -or- MA

B. OFFENSES PROHIBITED IN AREAS DESIGNATED BY ORDER

(k)	Violating any State law specified in the order concerning burning, fires or which is for the purpose of preventing, or restricting the spread of fires.	\$100

36 C.F.R. (Posted Order 261.50 & 261.51) 261.53, Special Closures

When provided in an order, it is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of:

(a)	Threatened, endangered, rare, unique, or vanishing species of plants, animals, birds or fish.	\$100
(b)	Special biological communities.	\$100
(c)	Objects of areas of historical, archeological, geological, or paleontological interest.	\$100
(d)	Scientific experiments or investigations.	\$100
(e)	Public health or safety.	\$100

(g)	The privacy of tribal activities for traditional and cultural purposes. Second moving traffic offense within a 12-month period, as evidenced by information recorded on operator's license, or by other evidence.

Injury, damage, or removal of any Federal property except under authority of law (unless said injury, damage or removal is within the posted amounts listed hereinabove).

If a person charged with an offense in the attached sections of the Schedules of this Order fails to post and forfeit collateral, any punishment, including fine, imprisonment, or probation, may be imposed within the limits established by law upon conviction by plea or after trial.

WHEREFORE, this Order shall constitute the Court's policies with regard to collateral forfeiture in petty offense matters.
