STANDING ORDER RELATING TO SEALED DOCUMENTS

It appearing to the Court that the United States Probation Office and the United States Office of Pretrial Services often require access to charging documents and certain other information from criminal files, i.e., the defendant*s criminal history, personal background, charges pending, and other information necessary for the preparation of a presentence investigation report, it is therefore **ORDERED** that, in such cases that have been sealed by the Court, at the request of the United States Attorney, or otherwise, the United States District Court Clerk for the Southern District of Alabama is authorized to timely provide to the United States Probation Office and United States Pretrial Services, at their request, copies of that file material customarily disclosed in non-sealed cases. In such sealed cases, said file material shall be clearly marked as pertaining to a sealed case, and the United States Probation Office and United States Pretrial Services shall exercise caution to prevent unauthorized disclosure regarding the sealed criminal case to any third party.
